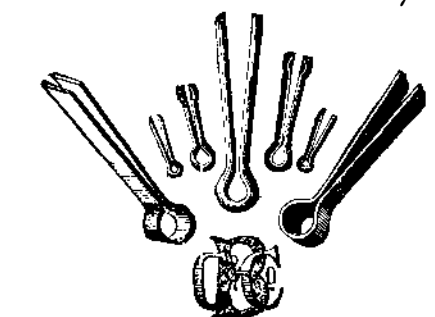

Packages for this Exposition take the following route: Shipped at the dock of the Pacific Mail S. S. Co. in New York, or San Francisco, they are, upon the payment of one dollar, gold, for each package not weighing more than 200 pounds, or measuring more than 20 cubic feet, taken to Panama and delivered to the South American S. S. Co., whose steamers carry them to Valparaiso, and there deliver them to the agent of the Exposition, who attends to their transportation, by railway, to the place of exhibition. The one dollar gold is the only expense of transportation to the place of exhibition, Santiago. An exhibitor may send as many packages as he pleases under this regulation. Heavier or larger packages may be shipped per same lines at low rates under special contract. Applications for room at the Exposition must reach Chili by January 1, 1875. Machinery for Manufacturing, for Mining, and used in Agriculture, are especially invited. 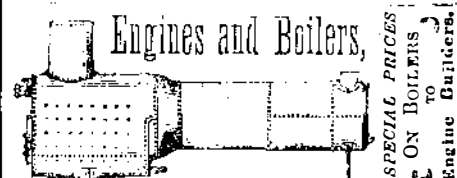
