THE NIZE TOOL WORKS, HAMILTON, O.: The Boring and Turning Mill, 10-ft. awing, you made for us, is doing nobly. In the construction of the engines for the Pittsburgh Water Works we have tested it through a great range of work, and it has in every instance er-ceeded our best-formed expectation of its capabilities. We have cut off the sinking heads, and bored, faced, and turned the Valve Chambers, weighing about 12 tons each—which work it would be almost impossible to do in a lathe, owing to the difficulty of securing them to the face-plate by the narrow danges. These we chucked and beld with perfect ease and little labor. We have also turned, scraped, and polisbed all over cylinder heads. The Crosshaads of wrought iron were bored and turned, also the Piston Heads, the holes being a perfect taper. We have had occasion to finish Valve-seats at the bottom of a chamber 36 inches deep; the tool-bars, even at this extreme reach, performed with perfect steadiness. We may also state that we bored and turned a pulley 10 ft. diameter, 18 in. face, and hole 6½ in., in fifteen hours—this time includes putting it on and taking it of the machine. We offinarily required four days to the same work on our lathe. It is unnecessary to further enumerate what we have done.
