

FOREIGN PATENTS. Their Cost Reduced.

The expenses attending the procuring of patents in most foreign countries having been considerably re-duced, the obstacle of cost is no longer in the way of a large proportion of our inventors patenting their inventions abroad.

CANADA.—The cost of a patent in Canada is even less than the cost of a United States patent, and the former includes the Provinces of Ontario, Quebec, New Brunswick, Mova Scotia, British Columbia, a d Manitoba.

The number of our patentees who avail themselves of the cheap and easy method now offered for obtaining patents in Canada is very large, and is steadily increasing.

ENGLAND .- The new English law, which went into force on Jan. 1st. enables parties to secure patents in Great Britain on very moderate terms. A British patent includes England, Scotland, Wales, Ireland, and the Channel Islands. Great Britain is the acknowledged financial and commercial center of the world, and her goods are sent to every quarter of the globe. A good invention is likely to realize as much for the patentee in England as his United States patent produces for him at home, and the small cost now rendersit possible for almost every patentee in this country to secure a patent in Great Britain, where his rights are as well pro-tected as in the United States.

CIHER COUNTRIES.—Patents are also obtained on very reasonable terms in France, Belgium, Germany Austria, Russia, Italy, Spain (the latter includes Cuba Australia, and the other Spanish Colonies), Brazil, British India, Australia, and the other British Colonies


