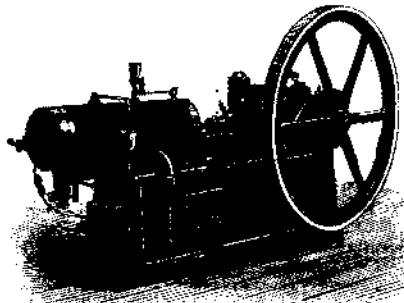

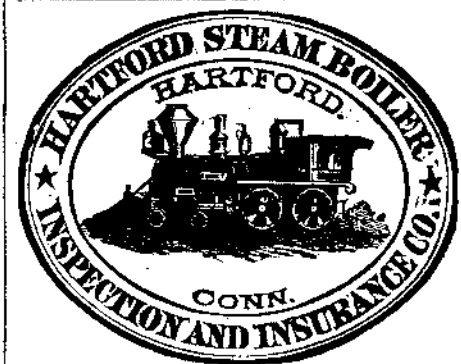


"The Baldwin" Exhibited at the late American Institute Fair, New York. A four horse-power engine in connection with storage battery, running 34 incandescent electric lights.
