(7178) A. L. B. asks how to give photoraphs a glace finish. A. Apply the prints face down while wet to the smooth varnished side of a ferrotype plate, which should be rubbed with powdered tale, squeezing it by rolling a rubber roller over the back, hav ing blotting paper between the print and paper. When dry it will have a high polish and drop off the sheet. The polish is called glace finish. To mount such prints with out losing the gloss, make the following mounting solution: Soak 1 oz. refined gelatine in cold water for an hour, then drain off and squeeze out the water as much as possible; put the gelatine in a jelly pot and place the latter in a pan of hot water on the fire; when the gelatine has melted stir in slowly 234 oz. pure alcohol, and bottle for use. This glue will keep indefinitely, and can be melted for use in a few minutes by standing the bottle in a basin of hot water. As it contains a very small percentage of water, it hardly affects the gloss of the prints and dries almost immediately.
