If you wish a continuous service use a bichromate, an Edison-Lalande or a gravity battery. 'The directions for making the bichromate battery are given in SUPPLEMENT, No. 792.

(7631) L. A. D. asks: Is there any danger in amalgamating the zinc of the gravity battery in putting on the mercury too thick? Also, in making the regular Crowfoot do they add the mercury while melting the zinc, or do they rub the mercury on afterward? A. Only a film of mercury can be made to adhere to zinc. The rest you may put on will run off as water does. The mercury is combined with the zinc in the Carr composite These do not require amalgamating and can be bought of dealers in electric supplies. 
