American Merchants.

It is not generally understood amongst merchants that in many foreign countries the first registrant of a Trade Mark becomes the legal owner of said Mark, even though he may not be the bona fide proprietor. Many American goods are copied by foreign competitors who put inferior goods on the market and sell them under the American Trade Marks. If these imitators have secured registration for said Trade Mark, they become, in many foreign countries, the legal owners of the Mark, and it will not be possible for the real owners afterwards to procure protection for their Trade Marks. Great bardship often arises in this manner. The only way to prevent such a course is for the American merchant to register his Trade Marks in the countries with which he has commercial relations
