going at 10 miles an hour. B holds (a) that the second train will strike with less force and (b) that it will take longer to pass the first train. A. The swifter train will pass the slower train as if it were standing still and the swifter had a velocity equal to 10 miles per hour, the difference of the two velocities. All these answers are based upon the supposition that the resistance of the air is excluded from the problem, as is usually done in such cases. This is not necessary, however, in these answers, since it is stated in the questions that a certain definite velocity is attained, the resistance of the air being one of the elements in attaining the velocity.
